**Definition:** Open and responsive to suggestion; easily persuaded or controlled.

**Synonyms:** Compliant, Acquiescent, Biddable, Manageable

**Antonyms:** Uncooperative

**Usage:** An easy-going, amenable child.

**2. Juncture (Noun)** - समय

**Definition:** A particular point in events or time.

**Synonyms:** Point, Point in time, Time

**Antonyms:** Cleft, Crack, Crevice

**Usage:** The plane crashed at the juncture of two mountains.

**3. Scrutiny (Noun)** - संवीक्षा

**Definition:** Critical observation or examination.

**Synonyms:** Crevice examination, inspection

**Antonyms:** Glance, cursory look

**Usage:** Every aspect of local government was placed under scrutiny.

**4. Strenuous (adjective)** - ज़ोरदार

**Definition:** Requiring or using great effort or exertion.

**Synonyms:** Arduous, Difficult, Hard, Tough

**Antonyms:** Easy, Effortless, Half-hearted

**Usage:** The government made strenuous efforts to upgrade the quality of the teaching profession.
