**1. Defuse (Verb)** - नाकाम कर देना

**Definition:** Remove the fuse from (an explosive device) in order to prevent it from exploding.

**Synonyms:** Deactivate, Disarm, Disable,

**Antonyms:** Activate

**Usage:** A scheme that teaches officers how to defuse potentially explosive situations

**2. Loom (Verb)** - आस रहना

**Definition:** Appear as a vague form, especially one that is large or threatening.

**Synonyms:** Be Imminent, be on the Horizon

**Antonyms:** Abate, Decline, De-Escalate, Die

**Usage:** Vehicles loomed out of the darkness"

**3. Tranche (Noun)** – हिस्सा

**Definition:** A portion of something, especially money.

**Synonyms:** Share, Portion, Part

**Antonyms:** Misfortune, Good Luck, Success

**Usage:** They released the first tranche of the loan

**4. Pendency (Noun)** - लम्बित

**Definition:** The state of being pending

**Synonyms:** Imminent, Impending, Undecided and Awaiting.

**Antonyms:** Avocation, Entertainment, Fun and Recreation

**Usage:** "the defendant should be restrained from further public comment during the pendency of the trial"
